Title: Appropriate use of AI in Family Medicine

- 1 **WHEREAS** Artificial intelligence tools for health care are evolving rapidly, and encompass applications
2 that can manage administrative tasks, provide clinical decision support, and assist with population
3 health and care management support, and
- 4 **WHEREAS** all of these areas are frequently cited as aspects of primary care that contribute to family
5 physician stress and burnout, and
- 6 **WHEREAS** Oregon is confronting an ongoing and worsening crisis of access to primary care clinicians,
7 and the potential exists for health systems and policy makers to promote the rapid adoption of
8 technologies such as AI to help alleviate that crisis, and
- 9 **WHEREAS** family physicians and their representatives must ensure that these technologies, and policy
10 decisions related to their adoption, are pursued in ways that are truly assistive and strengthen the role
11 of family physicians as leaders of care teams, now therefore be it
- 12 **RESOLVED** that the OAFP will develop a policy position statement or statements to inform the advocacy
13 efforts of the Academy, and to be communicated to members.
