REPORT OF THE FAMILY PHYSICIANS OF OREGON PAC

The Family Physicians of Oregon PAC (OAFP PAC) is organized to support OAFP policy advocacy through expenditures on Oregon state elections. The OAFP PAC targets support for lawmakers who are shaping the future of primary care in Oregon, and it is the professional responsibility of all members of the medical community to be involved in the political process.

Membership in the PAC is annual, based on the calendar year. If you are not sure if you have donated to the PAC, check with OAFP Staff. Online donations are welcome at any time; recurring donations of \$25/month or more are especially welcome.

The PAC Board set a goal of increasing active PAC membership by 50 new members by the end of 2021 through targeted outreach. Through a campaign where PAC Board members made specific outreach to colleagues, and a mailed summer contribution drive, the PAC was able to raise contributions totaling \$5896, an annual record! While we did have several new donors, we still have a long way to go to get to our target membership. 2021-2022 Activities

OAFP members contributed more than \$3600 so far this fiscal year. In early January, the PAC hosted a briefing with OAFP lobbyist Iris Maria Chavez to get a preview of the short legislative session and of the upcoming 2022 Campaign season. The group met again in late March to discuss the primary season landscape.

C&E Systems, our PAC management vendor, provides accounting services for the funds, receipts to contributors, and ensures required regulatory reporting is completed.

PAC Expenditures in FY 2021-2022

This fiscal year has not been an election year, but the PAC did make one contribution to a campaign. **Lisa Reynolds** (D-SW Portland) –\$500 (Still in primary season; campaigning in a newly-drawn district with a tougher-than-usual fight).
