Relating to overtime for agricultural workers; prescribing an effective date.

Prohibits employers from permitting or requiring agricultural workers to work in excess of maximum allowable hours unless workers are compensated for overtime hours worked.

Creates income or corporate excise tax credit allowed to employer for excess amount of wages paid as overtime pay to agricultural workers. Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2023, and before January 1, 2029.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

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Relating to health care; declaring an emergency.

Deletes requirement that coordinated care organization collect specified data from members and submit data to Oregon Health Authority. Allows authority to make certain releases of data. Allows pharmacy intern to transfer drug containing pseudoephedrine or ephedrine to person 18 years of age or older without prescription. Extends sunset on provisions regulating sharing of COVID-19 data to one year after date on which state of emergency declared by Governor on March 8, 2020, for COVID-19 pandemic, and any extension of state of emergency, is no longer in effect. Extends requirements related to biological products to January 1, 2026. Authorizes authority to implement reproductive health services and education programs. Allows physicians and physician assistants to use telemedicine. Defines "telemedicine." Prohibits Oregon Medical Board from establishing standards for telemedicine that are stricter than standards for in-person delivery of pharmacy services.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1/25/2022 - Iris Maria Chávez - Appears to be a technical fix omnibus bill. Includes SOGI/REAID data clarifications, pseudoephedrine dispensing updates, COVID data, OHA and reproductive health education, and defines/updates telemedicine.

Relating to health care.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study and make recommendations for options to improve access to or lower cost of health care in Oregon. Requires authority to implement recommendations to extent of agency's existing statutory authority and report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health any legislative changes necessary to fully implement recommendations.

Relating to coordinated care organizations; declaring an emergency.

Modifies financial requirements for coordinated care organization expenditures on social determinants of health and health equity.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to expend on social determinants of health and health equity amount equal to or greater than three percent of authority's expenses in administering fee-for-service program in previous calendar year and to annually report expenditures to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health.

Prohibits authority from adopting rules that restrict coordinated care organization distributions or other expenditures above 200 percent of minimum required risk-based capital.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Relating to equity; declaring an emergency.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide grants to operate two culturally and linguistically specific mobile health units, as pilot program, to serve priority populations with histories of poor health or social outcomes. Requires authority to study feasibility of expanding mobile health units statewide and to provide interim report on findings to Legislative Assembly by December 31, 2025, and final report by June 30, 2026. Specifies criteria for study. Sunsets January 2, 2027.

Requires authority, based on recommendations from task forces convened by Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office, to develop recommendations on how to fund robust culturally and linguistically specific intervention programs designed to prevent or intervene in health conditions that result in inequitable and negative outcomes for individuals who are Black or indigenous, people of color and members of tribes. Requires office to report recommendations to Legislative Assembly by November 1, 2023. Sunsets January 2, 2025.

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Relating to primary care.

Requires individual and group health insurance policies, health care service contractors, multiple employer welfare arrangements and state medical assistance program to provide reimbursement for at least three primary care visits annually in addition to one annual preventive primary care visit covered without cost-sharing. Exempts commercial plans offered to public employees by Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board.

Prohibits individual and group health insurance policies, health care service contractors, multiple employer welfare arrangements and state medical assistance program from denying coverage for services provided by behavioral health home and patient centered primary care home because services were provided on same day or in same facility. Limits copayments for services provided by behavioral health home and patient centered primary care home on same day or in same facility.

Prohibits individual and group health insurance policies, health care service contractors, multiple employer welfare arrangements and state medical assistance program from requiring prior authorization for specialty behavioral health services provided at behavioral health home or patient centered primary care home.

Relating to health care providers; declaring an emergency.

Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to meet monthly with specified health care providers to discuss providers' concerns regarding insurer practices.

Requires department to study trends in reimbursement paid to specified health care providers and report findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health no later than November 30, 2022.

Requires Division of Audits of Secretary of State to conduct audit of practices and drug pricing mechanics of pharmacy benefit managers that contract with state agencies and report findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health no later than September 15, 2023.

Requires department to adopt rules to implement statutory requirements related to pharmacy benefit managers and apply requirements to contracts that automatically renew on or after effective date of Act.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

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Relating to access to information about community services; declaring an emergency.

Requires Health Information Technology Oversight Council to convene one or more groups of stakeholders and experts to explore options to accelerate, support and improve secure, statewide community information exchanges. Requires council to provide to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health and to human services draft report no later than September 15, 2022, and final report no later than January 31, 2023, on findings of stakeholder and expert groups and recommendations for legislative changes, if needed, to implement statewide health information and community information exchanges.

Sunsets February 28, 2023.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Specifies reimbursement that must be paid by insurers covering universal newborn nurse home visiting services.
