



• PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I have lost count of how many times over the years I have heard or uttered the phrase “family medicine is a team sport”. The accuracy of this statement becomes ever more relevant to our specialty as we strive to meet the growing, interconnected social needs of patients in this fragmented healthcare environment. Throughout medical school, residency, and my initial years of practice I witnessed the essential team within family medicine expand to include care coordinators, clinical pharmacists, behavioral health specialists, physical therapists, and registered nurses. I now cannot fathom working in a clinic without a robust team of staff members to support the complex medical, social, and behavioral health needs of my patients. However, the residency clinic where I teach recently experienced a wakeup call to the reality of financial hardship that many healthcare organizations across the state are facing when the community health worker (CHW) position was cut from several primary care clinics in the system.

My colleagues and I immediately thought about the patients who would not be getting an expected follow up call from our CHW who supported the highest needs patients. Our community health worker helped the patients in ways that cannot be captured in a medical record or defined by a quality measure. She met patients at the housing office to talk with them while they were waiting in

line for an application. She delivered goods to their homes, helped them plan bus routes, and waited on hold to arrange medical transportation to the appointments that would have otherwise been forgone. She took family medicine residents on wild mushroom foraging trips in the local mountain range, eagerly sharing her knowledge and best foraging spots. She sat with patients in the ER waiting room on multiple occasions who had previously experienced medical trauma and were reluctant to seek life-saving treatment. Even when patients were dubious about talking to a clinic staff who was not their primary doctor, they would eventually grow to trust and confide in her which often led to learning about important aspects of my patient's lives that I could not elicit in a twenty-minute office visit. What she brought, the CHW position brings, to primary care is health equity and the flexibility to engage patients where they are. The National Academy of Science, Engineering, and Medicine (NASEM) Committee published a report in 2021 laying groundwork for implementing high quality primary care on a national level. The first objective in this report was to “pay for primary care teams to care for people, not doctors to deliver services.” However, the workforce that it takes to holistically care for people produces unrecognized work under fee for service and is at high risk for getting reduced when institutions are struggling financially. While the value of family medicine used to come almost

exclusively from the physician-patient continuity relationship, it isn't the only continuity relationship that matters anymore. For family medicine to remain a team sport, all the key players need to invest equally in sustainable payment pathways for primary care and ensure that such payments are directly invested in the resources needed to deliver advanced, interprofessional primary care services.

• GREETINGS FROM THE OAFP

On October 12, members of the OAFP Board gathered in Portland to work on a new strategic plan to carry the OAFP through 2025 and 2026. At the offices of Comagine Health, the group spent the day considering internal and external trends that are influencing our work, and identified areas where the organization's staff and leadership should focus as they invest time and resources into advancing the OAFP Mission to *support family physicians in their pursuit of optimal health for the people of Oregon.*

Squaring up to What's Next

Having accomplished the successful launch of our residency network, ORCA-FM, the group looked ahead as much as possible, knowing that our work is influenced by the policies that come from the Oregon legislature and US Congress, and that the November election, both in Oregon and nationally will shape the agendas and focus of those organizations. In addition, with the new Oregon Health Authority Director and Medicaid Director settling into their roles in Oregon, the OHA recently announced their strategic goals for 2024-2027:

These goals are all driving toward the previously-stated goal of eliminating health inequities by 2030. According to OHA, equity means all Oregonians:

- "Can reach their full health potential and well-being.
- Do not face disadvantages due to their race, ethnicity, language, disability, immigration status, age, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, geography, or social class."

OAFP policies are closely aligned with these goals and intentions, and we are pleased that the OHA is continuing its focus on these important issues. We're concerned, however, that the plan document itself makes no reference to the Patient Centered Medical Home model; in fact, the words "Primary Care" do not appear anywhere in the plan.

As OHA has turned to focus on empowering and supporting culturally specific social and health service organizations, which typically serve the needs of historically marginalized communities. With this focus, the state is perhaps demonstrating an understanding that the "old" way of working to improve equity and outcomes, through clinical and health system sources, must be combined with a robust network of agencies dedicated to addressing health related social needs in order to achieve our collective goals.

Pulling Focus Back to Primary Care

What worries me lately is the fact that necessary support for

our transformed primary care network is flagging. We can tell from the burnout in our members, the turnover in their clinics, and stagnant or declining reimbursement levels despite expanded payments for complex care, that we aren't "there" yet. In our efforts to drive payment that rewards delivering quality health care rather than high-volume care, without alignment across Oregon's fractured insurance market, I'm hearing that primary care clinics are reporting on up to 70+ quality measures and employing full-time staff members to manage prior authorizations. We need alignment, and equitable investment across insurers in these models of care, and a rapid reduction in the complexity of administering primary care.



With the new OHA strategic plan, and a new legislature on the way, OAFP staff and volunteers are finding and capitalizing on multiple paths to influence policy to steer attention back to primary care, to push for that simplification and meaningful investment. The sidebar at right is an incomplete list of places your OAFP is representing you in the conversations that are driving primary care.

Rebirth of the Public Health & General Preventive Medicine Residency at OHSU

As family physicians across Oregon continue to navigate an ever-evolving healthcare landscape, the need for a robust and well-prepared public health workforce has never been more apparent. In response to this critical need, we are excited to announce the rebirth of the Public Health & General Preventive Medicine (PH/GPM) Residency at OHSU, housed within the Department of Family Medicine. This program is a revitalization of the preventive medicine residency that many of you may recall, which was unfortunately discontinued in 2018 due to funding challenges. Thanks to an innovative funding award from CareOregon, we are now able to offer this vital training once again, with the first cohort of residents set to begin in the 2025-2026 academic year.

The Need for a Renewed Focus on Preventive Medicine

Following the COVID-19 pandemic and the multiple other public health challenges we have faced in recent years, we are increasingly aware of the importance of a well-functioning public health system and primary care network. Preventive medicine graduates often work side-by-side family physicians, and together they play a crucial role in ensuring that Oregon remains a leader in healthcare systems innovation and reform. The importance of preventive medicine has only increased as the ongoing challenges of managing chronic diseases, substance use, and disparities in healthcare have highlighted the need for an approach that emphasizes prevention and public health.

CareOregon, a large nonprofit healthcare organization with a mission to inspire and partner to create quality and equity in individual and community health, recognized the significant need for a program that addresses these challenges head-on. By awarding this grant to OHSU, CareOregon has helped make this residency program possible, ensuring that we can once again


train physicians who are not only skilled in clinical medicine but also adept in public health leadership, policy, and preventive care. "This partnership between CareOregon and the OHSU School of Medicine is one of a kind in the nation," said **Safina Koreishi, MD, MPH**, CareOregon's Senior Medical Director of Clinical Services. "It reflects our shared mission of addressing health equity in our communities. CareOregon is passionate about supporting healthcare workforce development and cultivating strong public health leaders throughout the state to focus on the systemic and social issues that impede health outcomes in our communities."

Program Structure and Curriculum

The PH/GPM Residency at OHSU will recruit two residents per year, providing them with a comprehensive and multidisciplinary training experience. Central to the residency is a required Master of Public Health (MPH) degree from the OHSU-PSU School of Public Health, which equips residents with the knowledge and skills necessary to address complex public health challenges. As part of this training, residents can choose between focused tracks in epidemiology and health management and policy.

In addition to their academic training, residents will participate in a wide variety of rotations that reflect the diverse needs of Oregon's population. These include placements at both rural and urban county health departments—specifically Columbia County Public Health and Multnomah County Health Department. These rotations provide residents with firsthand experience in public health practice across different settings, allowing them to understand and address the unique challenges faced by communities with varying resources and health needs.

Residents also can engage in patient care at Central City Concern, a federally qualified health center (FQHC) in the



Portland metro area. This experience is in keeping with the mission of both CareOregon and the Department of Family Medicine, which emphasizes a strong commitment to expanding healthcare access to underserved populations.

A Focus on Health Equity and Leadership

The mission of the PH/GPM Residency is to train future leaders in public health and preventive medicine, and we have tried to reflect this mission in every aspect of the program, from the curriculum to the partnerships we have established. Our residents will primarily train in safety net settings, and they will be encouraged to develop practicum projects in areas like implementing improvement science initiatives in primary care clinics, leading advocacy efforts to impact local or state health care policy or becoming involved in research efforts to support implementation of evidence-based policies at the population level.

Partnerships and Collaboration

The rebirth of the PH/GPM Residency would not have been possible without the support of many dedicated individuals and organizations. We are particularly grateful for the innovative funding award from CareOregon, which has been instrumental in providing the necessary resources to bring this program to life.

We are also deeply appreciative of the many volunteer faculty who have contributed their time and expertise to this program. Many of these faculty members are board-certified in both family medicine and public health and general preventive medicine, bringing a wealth of knowledge and experience to the residency. Their involvement helps to ensure that our residents receive the highest quality education and training, grounded in real-world experience and a deep understanding of the challenges and opportunities in preventive medicine and primary care.

Looking Ahead

As we prepare to recruit our first class of residents this fall, we are excited about the future of the PH/GPM Residency and the impact it will have on the health of Oregon's communities. The challenges we face in public health and preventive medicine are significant, but so are the opportunities. By training the next generation of public health leaders, we are taking an important step toward a healthier, more equitable future for all Oregonians.

We invite all of you to join us in this endeavor, whether by spreading the word about the program, participating as volunteer faculty, or supporting efforts aimed at finding long-term sustainable funding for these types of educational programs. Together, we can make a difference in the health and well-being of our communities, one preventive measure at a time.

All signs are pointing to the start of the fall season; leaves are turning color, campaign mailers and TV advertisements are arriving in homes across the state, and the Oregon Academy of Family Physicians is making plans for the 2025 legislative session.

The last several election cycles have brought significant turnover in the state legislature and this year will be no different as people continue to retire, are banned from running for their seats (due to Ballot Measure 113), or run for other offices. We will see similar turnover for the upcoming 2025 legislative session.

As election activities swirl around

us, the OAFP, alongside many partner organizations and individuals, are exploring legislative priorities that would re-center Oregon's commitment to primary care access, affordability, and innovation in healthcare policy making. OAFP and the Oregon Residency Collaborative Alliance for Family Medicine (ORCA-FM) will be asking the legislature to re-appropriate state funding for ORCA-FM's operations, following successful, first-time funding from the state allocated in 2023 (SB 490.)

Legislators and the Governor are also in the process of developing their legislative and budget priorities for 2025. As the Governor works with state

agencies to craft their biennial budgets and the legislature tries to determine their spending priorities, the state economist presented the September 2024 economic and revenue forecast to legislators. This forecast predicts available state resources for services in the upcoming 2025-2027 budget and provides the framework for the upcoming Governor's Recommended Budget (GRB), which will be released by December 1 (the November 2024 revenue forecast will provide the legislature additional information for their budget making process, but the May 2025 revenue forecast will be the final determinator for available spending in the 2025-2027 biennium.)

Overall, policymakers received good news in the form of \$633.6 million more dollars to spend than previously predicted. (\$633.6 million is roughly equivalent to how much money is needed to operate our state prisons for six months.) However, they also received news that once again, we should expect a large (almost \$1 billion) personal kicker. Given the news on the personal kicker policymakers remain concerned that there will be insufficient revenues during the 2025-2027 budget years to meet the predicted needs for services. Shortfalls could occur due to increased caseloads in Oregon Health Authority, Oregon Employment Department, and Department of Human Services program caseload increases that must be funded.

Because of this potential shortfall, they have highlighted the following areas as top priorities:

- 1) boosting base-level funding for Oregon's K-12 school districts,
- 2) renewing the "provider taxes" from hospitals and insurance companies to fund the Oregon Health Plan,
- 3) reexamining how the state pays for wildfire costs,
- 4) addressing the significant deficit in the state highway fund, and
- 5) increasing resources for housing, homelessness, workforce, addressing climate change and behavioral health services.

Given this financial climate we expect that "new" spending will be curtailed this biennium and programs which have received one time funding, in past legislative sessions, will need to show a strong base of support, a need that is directly tied to legislative and executive branch priorities, and shows a solid return on investment for itself. During legislative sessions with

significant financial constraints, we do see more focus on straight policy legislation. For example, modernization of Oregon's Corporate Practice of Medicine law is policy legislation, which OAFP is working on with House Majority Leader Ben Bowman (D-Tigard) and will be introduced (again) this legislative session.

Legislative concepts will be due to the legislature in early December, and combined with the November election and November revenue forecast, we'll have a much more clear picture of what to expect on healthcare policy by year's end.

OHSU's FMIG has been busy this summer with community outreach and understanding the work of our community doctors.

FMIG was privileged to expand our community engagement this year by hosting four separate medical career exploration workshops for high school students in Oregon, especially those who are underrepresented or living in communities historically and intentionally excluded. Our first workshop this year was our annual trip to Ida B. Wells High School in Southwest Portland, with the help of beloved teacher Aaron Olson. Then, in collaboration with the Oregon Healthcare Workforce Institute Area Health Education Center (OHWI AHEC) Synapse Camps, our next two workshops were in North Portland and Hillsboro. We closed out the series in Bend as part of a collaboration with the Cascades East AHEC Medstars Camp. In all, we reached over 100 high school students!

Each day started with a panel for the high school students to converse with OHSU medical students and physician leaders. Though each panel had its own flavor, they were all wonderfully inclusive, with no shortage of fruitful discussion. High school students wanted to hear from our panelists on how to choose between medical school and other health careers, how to align your medical

In the spirit of primary care, some ongoing mentor-mentee relationships formed out of these workshops. FMIG can't wait to host future workshops and stay involved with these communities.

practice with personal and community values, how to guide patients and families through mortality and grief, how to afford a career in primary care, and more. After the panels, our FMIG representatives had a blast splitting up into smaller groups to teach the high school students how to suture. The students were so engaged with the suturing lesson that many of them were eager to learn more advanced techniques by the end of the day. There were some impressive mattress sutures!

In the spirit of primary care, some ongoing mentor-mentee relationships formed out of these workshops. FMIG can't wait to host future workshops and stay involved with these communities.

Then, in August, FMIG had the wonderful opportunity to host our very first Community Physicians Roundtable in partnership with the Student National Medical Association at OHSU. It was a memorable evening where fifteen undergraduate through fourth-year medical students gathered to delve into primary care pathways in community health, guided by three physicians dedicated to bridging health equity gaps in our local communities: Dr. Michele Babaie from NxNE Community Health Center, **Dr. Aaron Gale** from Virginia Garcia Memorial Health Center, and **Dr. Greg Guffanti** from Neighborhood Health Center. Each physician shared their lived experience from medical school to the CHC/FQHC setting and offered invaluable perspectives on the impact we can have as physicians. The conversations were rich and engaging, covering topics from training and finding one's calling to using out-of-the-box thinking like blood pressure checks at barber shops for better care of historically and intentionally excluded communities. FMIG is excited to continue connecting academic and community medicine through events like these!

I would like to express my gratitude to Eva for trailblazing this role. Dr. McCarthy stepped into this role on the heels of George Floyd's death and subsequently, our country's reckoning with racism.


As the first OAFP member to take on this position she has been integral in defining the task force's purpose within the larger context of the Oregon Academy of Family Physicians. She spearheaded the racial justice charter which is a document that continues to anchor our task force's vision.

For me, as only the second task force chair, much work lays ahead to ensure that our work continues to be integrated into every aspect of the OAFP Board's strategic process

and that the purpose of our task force remains relevant to our OAFP members.

At this year's OAFP spring conference EID panel discussion, which brought a diverse group of community members representing traditionally underrepresented groups, the stories highlighted were a stark reminder that these voices continue to be overlooked. After the session, I was struck by the enthusiastic response and shared interest from our members to build deeper connections with these communities. This spurred me to think about how to effectively reach historically marginalized communities, given that often there is mistrust overlaid with social and geographical isolation that we must break through.

Through a series of conversations, I had a revelation that one strategy to connect with these communities is to tap into those doctors living in and providing care to these communities. However, from my own experience, doctors serving the most vulnerable are often overworked and wrapped up in their local community's challenges, so it is my belief that an invitation to the OAFP Board must be mutually beneficial, where a physician's contributions are rewarded by finding personal value and meaning in service to the board.

For this reason, I want to highlight my own experience with joining the OAFP Board of Directors. Prior to my invitation in 2021, I had been a passive member of OAFP- paying my dues, but that was about the extent of my participation. It took one phone call from **David Abdun-Nur, MD**, past OAFP President to change that. At the time we were at the peak of COVID-19 and I was knee deep with radio, community events, and supporting a Latino community that had been hit hard by COVID-19. David took the time to call me and congratulate me on my work and thanked me for representing family doctors as essential to our nation's strategy for ending the pandemic. At the end of our conversation, he told me that he would like to nominate me to serve on the board. Despite trepidation about how I would

balance board service along with my clinical duties and work in the community, I accepted. I now look back fondly on this decision as one of the best decisions in my professional career. Now having served on the OAFP Board in some capacity for four years, I feel a deep connection to my family medicine peers. Furthermore, surrounded by colleagues that embody the best attributes of family medicine, my identity as a family doctor has been solidified and with that, a deep pride in being a family doctor.

So as I look ahead to the next three years as Task Force Chair, I plan to work alongside my OAFP peers to invite physicians to the board with different perspectives, new ideas, and deep ties to communities that have been underrepresented.

Their understanding of the values and unique challenges of the communities they care for are an important step to building relationships and fostering trust with the most vulnerable patients across our state. Rooted at the center of our recruitment strategy should be a sustained effort for new board members to enhance their leadership skills, forge new friendships, and build community within the OAFP. I believe this is a cornerstone for building resilient family doctors in Oregon, and ultimately benefits the communities we serve.

My cup overflows after a successful visit to the nation's capital for FMAS. It was a great honor to be selected to attend and represent



Oregon family physicians. While we didn't have the opportunity to meet directly with any of our Senators or Representatives we did have some engaging conversations with their staffers. Our focus was on support of the REDI Act which would suspend interest accrual on student loans during residency, bringing back a bill to change the tax code so that all ACIP recommended immunizations can be billed via Medicare Part B and the Primary and Virtual Care Affordability Act that would change co-pay to be pre deductible if a patient went for a primary care visit. Not only did we discuss the issues selected by AAFP but we were given additional opportunities to talk about exciting programs being developed in Oregon. Such as the pilot program spearheaded by Dr. Bruno in Multnomah and Clackamas County whereby standing orders are available for EMTs to administer Narcan following an unintentional opiate overdose followed by immediate transportation to a treatment recovery

program. All in all, it was a successful day on the Hill and a very informative conference.

National Conference of Constituency Leaders (NCCL)

NCCL is the AAFP's leadership development event which takes place each year in the spring in Kansas City, MO. Representatives from constituencies that were historically underrepresented in medicine (women physicians, BIPOC physicians, new physicians, LGBTQ+ physicians and allies, and physicians who are international medical graduates) meet for three days to develop advocacy skills, elect national officers, and participate in their own Congress of Members. Resolutions passed at NCCL are then carried forth to be voted upon by the entire AAFP community at the Congress of Delegates in the fall. This year we were fortunate to have representation in four of the five member constituencies.

Amanda Aninwene, MD (BIPOC Physicians)

This year was my third time attending NCCL. This great meeting of the minds has brought me more encouragement and comradery than I had ever expected. Not only do we meet other physicians/people/friends from across the country, but we passionately work together to improve the health of the nation, our specialty, and ourselves. NCCL gives a voice to the overlooked and underrepresented. It has made me feel less alone in places where I stand out for who I am inside and how people perceive me from the outside.

What I really love about NCCL and its participants is the aim to reject the virtue signaling of the “business of medicine”. Too often we boast values without backing them up, but at NCCL, we make our values to be walked out. I’m forever grateful to our OAFP staff for giving me this opportunity. I know it has changed the course of my career and life.

My greatest takeaway was witnessing the active conversations that happened around topics and concerns that were more closely related to what I have experienced thus far in my medical career. My identity intersects multiple backgrounds — queer, Asian, new physician, neuro-“spicy”. To sit among others who identify even with one of these, and in a conference that held space and listened to me, meant the world to me. This conference felt much like an introduction to advocacy for me, which I personally do not

do much of thus far. I look forward to more opportunities like these and to personally growing my advocacy and resolution writing skills. I’m excited to be part of the beautiful process of making a difference within our organization!

I develop new skills every time I attend NCCL. Early on, during the pandemic, I refreshed my memory on Robert’s Rules of Order and learned how to take better care of myself while working exceptionally hard. The next year, I collaborated with experienced attendees and learned to create compelling resolutions. More recently, I took the lead on crafting multiple resolutions while paying forward the mentorship I received for newer attendees. In 2024, I improved my networking skills, and have continued to correspond with other conference attendees about practice tips and politics in the months since we met. What strikes me the most is that every year, even though I ought to know what to expect, I am astounded at the wealth of knowledge, kindness, and determination shared by so many

Roseburg Steals the Show with a Richard Simmons-Themed Booth


