Requires individual and group health insurance policies, health care service contractors and multiple employer welfare arrangements to provide reimbursement for at least three primary care visits annually in addition to one annual preventive primary care visit covered without cost-sharing.

HB 4150 EN	Passed	March 2, 2022	3/3/2022 - Chapter 10, (2022 Laws): Effective date March 2, 2022. 3/2/2022 - Governor signed. 2/25/2022 - President signed.
Requires Health Information Technology Oversight Council to convene one or more groups of stakeholders and experts to explore options to accelerate, support and improve secure, statewide community information exchanges.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to specified state agencies and Emergency Board for biennial expenses. 2/28/2022 End of session budget bill, contains spending across agencies and typically for special project appropriations.

Declares legislative intent to address risk to workers due to climate change impacts and climate hazards.

Allows Public Health Director to direct and deploy volunteer emergency health care providers under specified circumstances. 2/24/2022 Amendment on 2/23 put HB 4083 contents (minus PCP assignment for open card patients) into the bill. 4083 is now effectively inactive.
