And, so it begins! It was a fairly quiet start to 2023's long legislative session this week. A handful of policy committees met to introduce committee bills and/or hold informational hearings on subject matter likely to be in front of them this session; most Joint Ways and Means subcommittees didn't meet and will begin their informational hearings from state agencies next week. Legislators were pretty animated as *many, many* of them began their very first day as legislator. Luckily, they don't have much opportunity to lose their way (in the building, at least) as a good two-thirds of the Capitol remains under construction and inaccessible. If you remember the building well, the only portions available to access are the ground floor hallway (where committee hearings are held) and the House and Senate office wings. Finding places to gather for a chat/zoom/conference call or hang your coat are few and far between this year but that "Building Energy" is back in force!

Senator Brock Smith (SD -1, Southwestern Oregon) was sworn in on Jan 17th, replacing the resigned Sen Heard and creating an opening for the House District 1 seat to be filled by county commissioners. We'll keep you posted as that appointment develops, but we're looking forward to getting to know all the new legislators joining us this year! Look for more on bills of interest and what new Governor Kotek will be prioritizing in the weeks to come.

Committee Hearing Report outs

House Behavioral Health and Health Care 01/17/23

Sarah Lochner from the Oregon Coalition of Local Health Officials & Ryann Gleason from CFM Advocates present on the behalf of The Coalition of Local Health Officials about Local Public Health & Workforce issues. Bruce Goldberg the Chair of the Joint Task Force on Universal Health Care presented the finding to the House Committee On Behavioral Health and Health Care where they learned Oregonians would save roughly 1 billion on its first year after swapping to a single payer healthcare system. His ask is that the Committee support SB 704 that establishes a revenue board.

Alfonso Ramirez & Shawna McDermott from the OHA give a brief explainer on Behavioral Health. Cherryl Ramirez from the Association of Oregon Community Mental Health Programs and Heather Jefferis from Oregon's Council for Behavioral Health give a presentation on CMHP Role in the Public Behavioral Health System ending it with some proposed solutions. Dana Hargunani & Nathan Roberts both from OHA give a presentation regarding Updates from the OHA Dental Program. While Rep. H Pham, a dentist himself, advocates to support HB 3007. Paige Spence & Matt Calzia both from the ONA share their belief that Oregon's healthcare system is failing and its primarily due to a shortage of staffing mainly retention. While Andi Easton from Oregon Association of Hospitals and Health Systems beliefs while those problems do exist refutes the claim that is primarily a staffing issue.
