Governor's Budget Analysis

The governor has laid out her three top priorities: Housing/Homelessness, Mental Health and Addiction Services, and Education. This budget has no cuts and relies on redirecting \$765M that would have gone into reserves to the budget. \$1.35B from the 2021 legislature will be used for investment in behavioral health. Some of the proposed programs are \$195.7M for conunitied funding of 2021 investments and \$20M for health care provider incentive programs (estimated 1,000 new workers). A large portion of the budget is also coming from the Medicaid waiver which will bring in \$1.1B (\$500M going to the general fund) and the rest being between the governors 3 priorities. The budget is dedicating \$52,292M to human services making up 45% of the total budget.
