**REPORT OF THE FOUNDATION**

The OAFP Foundation reevaluated its mission, vision and values this year through a series of facilitated workshops. The Foundation Board of Trustees unanimously adopted the following:

**Vision**

Family medicine – every person, every need, everywhere in Oregon.

**Mission**

To build a healthier Oregon by investing in the education, leadership, and future of family physicians in every community.

**Values**

- **Generosity:** We give freely of our time, knowledge, and resources to nurture the next generation of family physicians
- **Access:** We empower family physicians to bring inclusive, compassionate, full-spectrum, person-centered care to every community
- **Collaboration:** We collaborate with dedicated family medicine leaders and community partners to achieve our common goals
- **Education:** We cultivate curiosity as the foundation of lifelong learning, personal growth, and innovation

The Foundation board created a new position, Immediate Past President, to allow for a smooth transition of officers in the future. The bylaws will be changed to reflect the new position and the tenure of officers will be changed to two years. We would like to include more community and corporate partners on our board. We are seeking additional OAFP members to also serve on the Board of Trustees.

The OAFP/Foundation supports medical students through the following programs:

- Laurel G. Case Award for Rural Experiences (travel stipends for students on rural rotations)
- The Mary Gonzales Lundy and Eva McCarthy Awards (scholarships for outstanding fourth-year medical students matching in a family medicine residency from each of Oregon's two medical schools)
- The Oregon AHEC Scholars Program (travel stipends)
- OHSU's Family Medicine Interest Group lecture series meals
- Outreach to family medicine interested students at Western U/COMP-Northwest
- Medical supplies for the OHSU Health Care Equity Week student-led clinic
- Medical supplies for the Western U/COMP-Northwest Equity Health Care Clinic
- Scholarships to the AAFP National Family Medicine Resident and Student Conference
- Scholarships for the OAFP Annual Conference

This year, we received an unprecedented amount of requests for Core Clinical Rotations, thus depleting the fund for the fiscal year. We will analyze our process for next year and may change the rules around funding, establishing a more equitable procedure for equal funding of the two medical schools. We hosted our annual cheese tasting at Western U/COMP-Northwest and made a presentation to the students about the programs available to them through the Foundation. We would like to work with them to create a more robust FMIG program, including support from AAFP.

Oregon family medicine residents receive support through the following programs:

- Resident emergency fund
- Scholarships for residents to attend the OAFP Annual Conference Scholarships for a resident delegate to attend the AAFP National Family Medicine Resident and Student Conference.

We had a major fundraising push at the end of 2025. With partnership support from the Oregon Dairy and Nutrition Council and Tillamook Creamery, we hosted a virtual cheese tasting that raised over \$4,000. The event was held at Western University of Health Sciences College of Osteopathic Medicine of the Pacific Northwest.

We made a financial investment in this year's auction. We hope that the addition of the theme "Havana Nights" and a Dance Showcase we have created a more exciting experience for our attendees. This year's auction was a hybrid event with online bidding for silent auction items beginning on Friday, May 23 and ending at 8:30 pm at the auction last night. More than 100 items were donated by OAFP members and community supporters to the auction. Last night's live event was a fun way to recognize our scholarship winners and celebrate together. The goal of the silent and live auction is to raise a minimum of \$30,000 each year in support of our scholarship programs. Additionally, we are investigating other ways to fundraise throughout the course of the year. The Foundation gratefully received donations this year in the form of donated speaker honoraria, and any donations received this weekend count toward the annual fundraising goal of \$40,000.

Total assets of the Foundation as of May 21, 2025 are \$163,602.49.
