



Reproductive Health in Primary Care

Primary care clinicians are cordially invited to participate in the Reproductive Health in Primary Care ECHO sponsored by Oregon State Legislative Funds.

What Is ECHO?

ECHO is a tele-mentoring program that uses videoconferencing technology to combine brief expert presentations with interactive and practical case presentations from participants. The overall goal of ECHO programming is to build new capacity for care at the community level.

Focus of This ECHO

The goal of this 8-session ECHO is to build the capacity of primary care clinicians and their team members to provide culturally responsive and equitable reproductive health care to their patients. This course will focus on contraception and abortion care.

Topics will include:

- Post-Roe family planning policy and care update – nationally and in Oregon
- Incorporating autonomy, patient-centered care, and reproductive justice into your practice
- Contraception best practices
- LARC update, difficult placements
- Medical abortion provision
- Pre- and post-abortion care
- Pharmaceuticals: misoprostol, mifepristone, hormonal contraception & oral emergency contraception
